



## **Galway City Council performance reviewed by NOAC as part of its Scrutiny Process**

The National Oversight and Audit Commission (NOAC), the independent oversight body for the local government sector in Ireland, today, published its **individual review of Galway City Council** as part its Scrutiny Process.

This was the second review of Galway City Council with the first meetings taking place in March and October 2022 with the Scrutiny Report from that review being available on the NOAC website.

The first full cycle of the Scrutiny Process was completed in the latter half of 2024 and it allowed NOAC to provide a comprehensive overview of the functioning of all local authorities to the public, both positive and negative, as well as highlighting examples of best practice in the sector, such as through its annual Good Practice in Local Government Seminar.

NOAC decided to build on the good work already carried out and began a new, updated Scrutiny Process format. The new process includes a more detailed analysis of the performance of each local authority and a more structured format similar to the Joint Oireachtas Committees.

This process also includes the recording and transcribing of meetings, which are uploaded to the NOAC website, [www.noac.ie](http://www.noac.ie), as well as the preparation of a report on the engagement.

The Chair of NOAC, Michael McCarthy, commented that:

**The updated process allows for an even more detailed and open style of meeting, which gives the public an even greater insight into the performance of their local authorities.**
